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Christmas Tree Garland



Before you begin

Read all instructions before beginning project. Do not pre-wash fabrics. Before cutting, press fabrics with a dry iron on cotton setting if needed. Use a ¹/₄" (6.35mm)seam allowance and backstitch at the start and ending of seams.

Cutting

From each fat quarter cut:

3- 2" x 3" (5.08cm x 7.62cm) trunk pieces 6- 5" x 5" (12.70cm x 12.7cm) triangles.

Sewing

1. As shown above, pin two matching Triangles with **wrong** sides together and edges even. Start sewing ¼" (6.35mm) from the bottom edge of the Triangle, stop ½" (1.27cm) from the point, pivot and sew down the other side stopping ¼" (6.35mm) from the bottom edge. Repeat for remaining Triangles for a total of nine Trees.

Start 1/4"

from the

2. Fold a Trunk piece **wrong** sides together so short ends meet; pin and sew the sides.

Finished Size: 5 ½" x 6" (13.97cm x 15.24cm) Makes 9 Trees

Supplies Needed

- 3 Fabric Palette[®] Christmas fat quarters — 18" x 21" (45.72cm x 53.34cm)
- 1 pkg. Polyester Fiberfill
- ¾" (9.53mm) Grosgrain ribbon: 3 ½ yds. (3.43m)
- Craft glue
- Chopstick/wooden dowel
- Rotary cutter, mat and acrylic ruler
- Basic sewing supplies
- Sewing machine
- Iron and pressing surface
- Walking foot (optional)
- 3. Stuff the sewn Tree and Trunk with fiberfill, being careful not to overstuff.
- 4. Center the open end of the Trunk in the open end of the Tree and pin in place.
- 5. Sew across the bottom edge to close the opening and attach the Trunk. Repeat Steps 2 4 for remaining Trunks and Trees.
- 6. Tie a loop on each end of the ribbon. Mark the center with a pin. Measure 3 ½" (8.89cm) on each side of the center and pin a Tree top. Pin the rest of the Trees to the ribbon at 7" (17.78cm) increments.

2 Triangles

- 7. Glue the Tree tops to the ribbon.
- 8. Hang as desired.

Finished Care Instructions

Dust or wipe with a damp cloth.
